- 1 Samuel 8 Israel demands a King
- 1 Samuel 9-10 Saul is Chosen and anointed King
- 1 Samuel 11 Get the victory against the Amorites
- 1 Samuel 13 He gives a sacrifice in the place of Samuel
- 1 Samuel 15 Told to destroy the Amalekites and Agag the King
- 1 Samuel 15 13-35 God's Spirit no longer anoints him
- 1 Samuel 16 David comes to sing to run away the demons
- 1 Samuel 18-22 Saul seeks to kill David
- 1 Samuel 22:17-19 Saul orders the death of 85 innocent priests
- 1 Samuel 24 Saul goes into a cave and David spares his life
- 1 Samuel 26 David steals his spear and water bottle
- 1 Samuel 28 Saul goes to the witch at Endor
- 1 Samuel 31 Saul commits suicide on the battle field against the Philistines at Gilboa
