Fire On The Mountain

1 Kings 18

Introduction Israel and state of wickedness

- Ahab and Jezebel
- Elijah no rain / the widow at Zaraphath
- 3 years of no rain

Chapter 18:1-20

- 1. God tells Elijah to return to Samaria and He will send the rain
- 2. Obadiah seeks Elijah
- 3. Elijah confront Ahab
- 4. Mt. Carmel

Verses 21-24 The Bottom Line

- 1. 7 sayings of Elijah
- 2. How long will you be between two opinions
- 3. Either Yahweh is God or Baal is God
- 4. I will meet you on Mt. Carmel
- 5. Send 450 prophets of Baal
- 6. Take two bullocks
- 7. You call on Baal and I will call on Yahweh

Verses 25-29 The Baal Cry

- 1. From morning to noon they cried
- 2. They leaped on the altar
- 3. There was no answer
- 4. Verse 27 Elijah mocked (Cry louder / He talking to someone else / maybe he is busy / maybe he is on a trip / maybe he is asleep)
- 5. Then they cut themselves / blood gushed out everywhere
- 6. They prophesied all day till 3pm and there was no answer

Verses 30-35 The Built Altar

- 1. He gathered the people
- 2. He restored the altar of the Lord that had been broken down
- 3. 12 stones not made by man's hands
- 4. He dug a trench
- 5. He laid the wood and prepared the bullock
- 6. Barrels of water and drench the altar 3 times
- 7. Water filled the trench.

Verse 36-39 The Bold Prayer

- 1. At 3pm.
- 2. Lord God of Abraham, Isaac, and Israel.
- 3. Let it be known this day You are God.
- 4. I am Your servant.
- 5. I have obeyed Your word.
- 6. Then the fire of the Lord fell.
- 7. Deuteronomy 4:24 For the Lord is a consuming fire.
- 8. Deuteronomy 9:3 The consuming fire goes before you.
- 9. Hebrews 12:28-29 We are in a kingdom that cannot be moved, therefore serve with fear. For our God is a consuming fire.
- 10. The fire fell on wet wood.
- 11. When the people saw they said Yahweh is God, Yahweh is God.

Verse 40 The Baal Prophets

- 1. Kill them all.
- 2. Let not one escape.

What do we learn about God?

- 1. It comes down to the simple fact: Yahweh is God.
- 2. God is a consuming fire not bound by wet wood.
- 3. His glory matters above all else and He shows Himself to the unbeliever.
- 4. Revelation tells us that the fire will fall again to judge an unbelieving world.

What do we learn about ourselves?

- 1. Like Elijah, we speak for the living God even when we stand alone.
- 2. Like Elijah we have to restore the old altar and prepare the ground for God to fall.
- 3. Like Elijah when we obey God, we can speak directly and boldly do God.
- 4. Like Elijah, it is about bringing the power of God to a pathetic human race.
- 5. The world is begging for an answer from other sources that will never match the response of God.
