7:3-3-11 The Lepers Findings

- 3. Great question!
- 4. God terrified the Syrian armies and they fled.
- 5. The lepers found food and a deserted camp.
- 6. Lets go tell others.

7:12-15 The Lack of Faith

- 1. The King had no faith to even go and look.
- 2. He sent a team to check it out.
- 3. The lepers had faith but the kings had none.
- 4. The people of God would not move because of fear.
- 5. Sadie Robertson Mogadeshu, Somolia.
- 6. We must be fearless.

Verses 7:16-20 The Prophecy Fulfilled

- 1. The flour and bread was in abundance just as God had said.
- 2. The servant of the king was trampled by the people.
- 3. He saw but did not eat just as God had said.
